# **Deferred Admission/Reverse Transfer (DART)** What is DART?

Certain freshmen applicants who are denied admission to Salem State University may be offered the opportunity to participate in a deferred admission reverse transfer (DART) program with participating Massachusetts public community colleges. These students are guaranteed admission at a later date, provided that they meet program requirements. Participating community colleges include; North Shore Community College, Northern Essex Community College and Bunker Hill Community College.

Students receive three main benefits through DART.

- The student has guaranteed admission to any program at the university (except for nursing, fire science, occupational therapy, art, theatre BFA, music)
- They will transfer in at least 34 credits from the MassTransfer Block
- The student will automatically have their credits transferred back to their participating community college so that they can receive their associate's degree on their way to a bachelor's degree

## Eligibility

- 1. Enroll in a Commonwealth of Massachusetts public community college
- 2. Complete the 34 credits from the <u>Mass Transfer Block</u> (Please be aware, a student can transfer at the most 68 credits from a two-year institution)
- 3. Earn a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5

### When it is time to transfer:

- 1. Adhere to our <u>admissions deadlines</u>. Salem State follows a rolling admissions process and we continue to accept applications until the academic program is filled.
- Provide a Commonwealth of Massachusetts public community college official transcript that documents 34 completed credits, a 2.5 cumulative grade point average, and the "Mass Transfer Block" stamp from the community college.
- 3. Complete the DART program form (coming soon)
