





Annual Unduplicated Credit Headcount

2000-2001: The graduate count of 293 is the number that we reported to IPEDS, but on further inspection it did not look right. This was the first year of our Colleague conversion, and the way that we identified graduate students changed. Non-matriculated students enrolled in courses for graduate credit are now included, where previous counts were limited to degree students only. So while there was a significant increase in 2000-2001, the count was probably closer to the 2001-2002 number (216), which we believe is correct. The IR staff did spot checks on the student records that were included in the 293 count; while most were graduate level, there were a significant number whose program levels had converted incorrectly. Beginning in 2000-2001, annualized counts include students taking course for credit at our Art New England summer program in Vermont; this program may have had more of an impact on graduate enrollments than on undergraduate figures.

Performance Accountability Objective: Student Access & Success

First Year Retention Rate

MassArt's Fall 2001 cohort retention rate has been adjusted from that published in the Linear Trend Book. There were two cohort students included in the 2001 file who were never enrolled at MassArt. In addition, there were another 13 students from the 2001 cohort who were still enrolled in 2002. were included in the HEIRS file submitted, but were not caught by HEIRS tracking system because their records have no SSN's. Corrections to the fall 2001 cohort have been made.

Degrees Awarded Framingham Prior to FY 2003 Framingham State College did not provide data on the number of certificates or Post-Bacc Certificates awarded.

Berkshire Region:




Pioneer Valley Region:



Northeast Region:




Greater Boston Region:



Southeast Region:


